come secretary treasurer of the local chapter of the American Harp Society Inc. About 20 of the area's 60 harpists are members, she said.

Ms. Polter said the main character of the hospital she knows is a

tremendous drive for perfection. "They really like a challenge. The things that can go wrong with a harp ..."

Among those, she said, are humidity, which can cause strings to go out of tune, and heat, which can make strings break (a harpist can accidentally hit

the wrong pedal. Her goal now is to perform in public. "My idea is to share my music with other people. The demand for performing hospitals is fantastic," said Ms. Polter, a substitute teacher at Montclair schools in Birmingham and Farmington Hills.

THE FIRST time she performed publicly was in Flint, her home town, for a senior citizens' Christmas party in 1979. In August she played for a wedding, and she accompanied performers of "As You Like It" in June at Will O'Way Apparition Theatre in Bloomfield Township.
