TOM GOERS, leader of the fund drive, said about 400 persons streamed in and out of the pub during the evening.

The wild game supper raised over \$2,800 for the March of Dimes.

"It was a ball," commented Goers.

The affair featured such gastronomic delights as roast wild boar, venison, pheasant a la king, meatballs made of moose and the moose stroganoff.

Goers said local residents donated most of the food for the dinner. Don Patrick of Farmington equipped in a deer to augment the menu.

But the star of the evening was a wild boar donated by Leo's Wild Game Preserve of Dexter. The 95-pound animal ended up in the oven.

"The boar had to be quartered before we could get him in the oven. If we could have cooked outside, we would have put him on a spit and roasted him whole," Goers said.

HOWEVER, the main purpose of the event was to raise money for charity and the Farmington leaders came up with a new idea for raising the money. They sold names.
