Farmers' Market will soon begin another season of offering farm-fresh produce direct to the shopper from the farmer. The market will be open from 8 a.m. to 1 p.m. on Saturdays beginning on Aug. 1 on the grounds of Farmington Community Center, 24705 Farmington Road, just north of 10 Mile Road.

When the center brought the community its first Farmers' Market last year, between 30-40 stands were set up for business each Saturday. Farmers and back-yard gardeners brought their surplus fruits, vegetables, eggs, honey,

plants, flowers and herbs.

"Berries will be available this year from a farmer who tends a healthy crop of everbearing plants," said Jane Uphoff, speaking for the center.
