



Ford fans flock to an all-Henry show

The ninth annual two-day swap meet and all-Ford car show sponsored by the Ford and Mercury Restorers Club will be Saturday and Sunday at Dearborn's Ford Field, one mile west of Southfield Road, just north of Michigan Avenue.

About 750 vendors are expected for the swap meet, and about 15,000 visitors are predicted.

The Sunday car show will feature Fords built between 1932 and 1948, such as the 1946 convertible, 1934 pick-

up and 1934 5-window coupe pictured above. Trophies will be awarded for each class. Advance registration, which includes a two-day family swap meet pass, will be \$5. Show day registration will be \$2. Show proceeds will be donated to charity.

Visitors admission is \$1 per adult. A variety of refreshments will be available.
