"THEY ARE tired of making money,
I guess," Kchikian said of the strikers.
"With 700,000 people in this area out of

work, looking for work, these guys don't even negotiate, they just walk

out."

Both plants produce sink forging dies

used in making parts for the automotive, aircraft and heavy equipment industries. Rockwell International is a client of the company. During the strike Kchiklan, supervisory personnel and some temporary replacements, called scabe by the union, are doing some of the work of the die sinkers.

Kchikian, however, said he hasn't ruled out further negotiations with the striking die sinkers and said he will hire them back if a settlement can be

reached.

Strikers are optimistic that the strike can be settled if both sides can it down at the bragaining table.

"There's never been a grievance filed in this plant," said Mark Hosbuch of Millord, shop steward at Forge Die and Tool." All of a sudden he (Kenkitan) is taking such a hard-line attitude about the union running his men. But we're hoping for a breakthrough. There's nothing you can't settle without talking."

Teamster truck drivers have been honoring the picket lines at both plants, strikers said, but non-union truckers have been allowed to cross the line to

make pickups and deliveries.

The next scheduled meeting between Kchikian and union business agent Bill

Kchikian and union business agent Bill Gmerk is set for Sept. 14. The union has been demanding a 14-percent increase in the first year of a three-year contract, 10 percent in the second year and 8 percent in the third. The base rate for the skilled trade is \$10.57 at Forge Die and Tool prese plus \$1.96 per hour cost of living.
