## Sorrows State Champs

Take a bow, Our Lady of Sorrows High -- Michigan's Class C-D state wrestling champions.

In as dramatic a finish as prep wrestling ever has produced, Sorrows won the crown by two points Saturday, scoring 54 points to runnerup Itasca's 52.

Sorrows trailed by one point when the competition entered the heavyweight finals -- the concluding event for the program.

It was Barry Walsh for Sorrows against Bruce Handy of Clinton in a rematch of the battle they had staged the week before for the regional title.

**WALSH HAD WON** on that occasion. This time so much rode on his winning again.

1 - It meant the heavyweight state title.

2 - It meant a perfect season of competition for the 17-year-old 230-pounder, who's a senior.

3 - Much more, it meant the state title for his school -- an honor that never before has come to Our Lady of Sorrows.

Walsh won and thus ran his personal string of conquests to 30 without a setback.

On 21 occasions he pinned his rivals.

He won eight in the state tourney as he rose to the occasion in dramatic style.

Of course, it took more than just Walsh to win the state crown for Sorrows.

**COACH GREG DOTY** took six men to the state meet and five placed.

There was Paul Osentoski, a junior, who was fourth at 107 pounds.

There was senior Pat Kern, the runnerup for the 137-pound title.

### IN THE POCKET

Ted Bakatselos, the big Greek from Westland who compiled the highest bowling average in Observerland last season, has gone on another scoring rampage to make a bid for the honor again.

During the past week he posted a pair of 700 series. He started the week with a 733 in the Westland Senior House League in games of 295, 222 and 253 and then came back in the Classic with a 716.

The Classic is becoming one of the highest scoring loops in western Wayne County and for the second week posted five series above 700.

Hugh O'Neil showed the way with a 737, and was followed by Bob Kowalek 732, Jay Diabon 728 and Don McLeod 718 to beat out Bakatselos by two pins for fourth place.

Aside from boosting his own average Ted also helped his team-- Hawthorne Lanes-- to roll a 3861 series, the high mark for the season.

While all this high scoring was going on Earl Vanness gained the hard luck crown for the week. After starting his series in the Senior House league with a 196 he rolled 11 strikes in a row. Then with the entire league halted, he threw his twelfth ball-- and left up the No. 6 pin. It wobbled, but didn't fall. The 299 is high single for the league so he did salvage something.

**WHILE GASTON MOROIS** stole most of the thunder in the Senior House League at Bel-Aire Lanes with his record breaking 867 series, several other sharpshooters turned in commendable performances... in the Classic.

All told there were 113 games in double century figures, and 20 series above 600. Al Patton showed the way with 677, while Fred Bickle had a 297, and John Waddles and Bud Hansen posted identical games of 248.

The high single in the other leagues was a 278 by Bill Hordford. Audrey Lennon topped the ladies with 244.

**DICK BEATTIE**, the area's top southpaw, is giving his rivals something to think about in the Winderland Classic. Leading the averages almost since the start of the season he is now carrying a 217 and edged out about Tuesday night with a 672 series.

Top man for the night was Ken Guyser with a 691.

**THEY'RE STILL TALKING** about the Irons Bud Dum received from Lady Luck at Plymouth Bowl.

Currently a 159 average bowler, he was going along in his customary style with games of 146 and 148. Then, he suddenly found the pocket and posted 11 strikes in a row.

As the usual hush fell over the lanes he fired-- and, of all things, left up the baby split and had to settle for a 298 and a 592 series.

**MARILYN MAY** was named Bowler of the Month at Merri-Bowl. She had a 253 game. Gene Osowski gained the same honor among the men with a 230. Marilyn bowls in the Toast and Coffee circuit and Gene is with the K-C circuit.

**JOE TOMARIN**, bowling in the Bloch B'nai B'rith League at Oak Park Lanes, was high man this week with a 279 game in a 675 series. He carries a 175 average.

In the Tuesday Junior House League Ted Kellman showed the way with a 265 in 654.

**HANNAH WINTER**, a 150 average bowler in the Early Birds League, took scoring honors at Southfield Bowl. She opened with a 134 then came back with a 241 and closed with 198 for 573. It was her best series.

**JOE WILSON**, a 13-year-old lad who carries a 132 average in the Recreation League at Livonia Lanes, moved up among the pacemakers with games of 209 and 183.

Among the adults Jack Sharkey was high in the Iron Workers League with a 241. He was closely followed by Don Allen with 225 and Terry Rush with 217.

Doris Morris was high among the Ladies in the Classic with a 2-3-30-233 game in a 561-90-641 series.

Close behind her came Marge Brothers with 205-23-228 and Lee Schuyler with 192-30-222.

**GARDEN LANES** also cut in for a share of the honors in the 700 class when Bob Roberts fired a 702 in the Garden City Moose League. It was one of the highest series of his career.
