

Pen-Pals Reach Around The World For Friends

Fourth graders from Stuckey School and their pen pals in the Philippine Islands are learning how their friends live half-way around the world in an exciting project arranged by their teachers and the People-to-People organization. The teachers are Mrs. Marjorie Davis at Stuckey and Miss Margaret Constantino in the Philippines.

Last September the boys and girls at Stuckey wrote individual letters to unknown pen pals in the fourth grade of the Lawong Kupang Elementary School in San Antonio, Nueva Ecija, in the Philippines. In the letters, Mrs. Davis' students told what they looked like, how tall they were, their hair color, what they like to do, and all about their school.

It seemed a long wait until the exciting day when a packet of letters arrived from the Philippines. Ocean carried mail between the two countries takes six to eight weeks, and the answer arrived after Thanksgiving.

Some of the island children had chosen their pen pals and addressed a Stuckey child by name. Others wrote letters to "Dear Friend," and these were written by Stuckey boys and girls, until everyone had his own pen pal. (One pair was a natural, Albert at Stuckey writes to Albert at Lawong Kupang.)

that the Philippine students' desks "look like real old times ago." (They were primitive, wood benches and tables.) The Philippine boys and girls frequently exclaim over the beauty of the American pupils' desks. (They are steel, wood, and about 10 years used.)

The projects exchanged by classes from the two schools were planned by the two teachers during summer correspondence.

The American boys and girls prepared a unit about their families, Stuckey School, and the community of Redford Township. They sent pictures of themselves, their families, their homes, and the school.

They drew elaborate diagrams of Stuckey. In the process, they learned things they never knew before about their community, school, and even their families. They knew where their dads

worked, for instance, but they didn't know what their fathers did at work or why it was important.

They are waiting for letters and pictures from their pen

pals describing their homes and families in the Philippines. The objective of the pen pal project was for the students to gain an understanding of people in other parts of the world and how they live. Just as

important, though, Mrs. Davis observes that her students have learned to understand themselves better as they described their families, school, and community to their pen pals across the sea.
