## Dems Tell

Minutemen are sworn to "uphold the U.S. Constitution" and the Panthers their people."

AS STATED by club chairman Allen J. Sipher, the club's intent in adopting its resolution is to "make people aware that we are losing our freedoms."

Sipher said: "Maybe this country is embarking on another McCarthy era, but when McCarthy was in control he didn't have the White House." With exception of the reference to the Chicago Seven and the Black Panthers, most club members were in favor of the resolution as first written by Freedman.

**BUT ONE MEMBER** said: "If we're only going to protect the liberties of those we agree with, what have we done? I think people should realize that they just can't suppress the one thing without suppressing everything and losing their rights."

Freedman said: "If a poll were taken now, I think you'd find that 75% of the American people sustain the Chicago verdict. People strike out when they are threatened."

"The same thing happened in Germany - Hitler campaigned on law and order. History does have a tendency to repeat itself."

**ONE AMENDMENT** to the resolution was voted down. This called for a protest against the administration for what it has done with the willful help of Congress.

Alvin Vagnozzi pointed out: "It's the executive branch that is now carrying these things out." Whether any citation against the federal Congress will be written into a redrafted resolution will be decided by a four-man committee appointed by Chairman Sipher to re-word the original reference to the Black Panthers and the Chicago Seven.

**THE CLUB WILL KEEP** the following part of the original resolution as prepared by Freedman:

It fills an "infringement on constitutional rights" the threats to the communications media by Vice President Agnew and the use of subpoena powers to obtain privileged records from newspapers and television and radio regarding militant groups."

Also maintained was the resolution calling for a national day of mourning "to protest the loss of our constitutional liberties."

## Math Vital For Shop

**FARMINGTON** Farmington's vocational machine shop craft committee met Feb. 11 to establish criteria for good shop training in district high schools.

A list of personal characteristics for students was developed, and suitable courses recommended. Unanimous emphasis was placed on the importance of math for shop students. It was agreed that a one-semester course in industrial mathematics should be developed for them.

It was suggested by the committee that vendors be invited to make product presentations to high school classes to keep them up-to-date on what's new.

Present at the meeting were A. V. Fox of Index Manufacturing Co., George Kern of Kern Industries, Ronald J. Monette of Schoolcraft Community College, Richard Ca-

ton, technical and industrial coordinator; Gary Gray, instructor; and Earl D. Baumunk, director of vocational education.

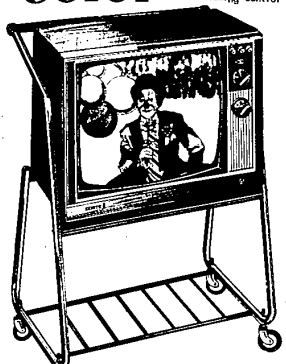
