Trustees examine school leasing deal

Walled Lake School Superintendent Don Sheldon may have violated board policy when he entered into a contract to lease two rooms in the Decker Elementary School to the Lakes Area Montessori School.
 The lease agreement calls for the district to receive payments of \$650 per month for the rental of the two classrooms.
 The apparent violation of board policy was spelled out by Trustee Patricia Jackman at a special board meeting last week, but it was Trustee Janet Callahan who launched the harshest condemnation of the superintendent's actions.
 Callahan said Sheldon's actions were "completely irresponsible." She later said that the actions of the superintendent displayed "total lack of common sense."
 Although Sheldon admitted he had made "perhaps an error" by entering

into the contract with the Lakes Area Montessori School, he took exception to Callahan's strong criticism.
 "I would never consider insulting your intelligence or character publicly as you do mine," he told Callahan.
 "I think it's uncalled for," he added.
 CALLAHAN'S remarks also were criticized by Laura Franz, a secretary at Walled Lake Central who told Callahan that it is the board's responsibility "to educate children — not slander and belittle people."
 The furor arose after Jackman and Callahan discovered the Walled Lake School District has leased two classrooms in the Decker Elementary School to the Lakes Area Montessori School.
 The lease, which was not presented to the school board for approval, was executed by Sheldon and Community Education Director Michael Duff, serving in the capacity as agents for the district.
 Jackman said Monday that the actions of Sheldon and Duff appeared to be clearly in violation of the district's policy against "commercialism" in the schools.
 The board has a policy that the district cannot rent a building or parts of a building to a profit-making organization.
 The Lakes Area Montessori School is a private, profit-making organization.
 THE POLICY also states that final approval of leases of facilities "rest with the Board of Education."
 "This is a lease of public facilities to a private organization for profit-making purposes," said Jackman in spelling out the alleged violation.
 Jackman also said the practice of permitting the Montessori School to operate in public school facilities has serious implications for the system of public education.
 "The Montessori Schools are preparation for independent learning," she said. "By letting them use our buildings, we're making it possible to lose students to private institutions."
 Jackman added that the loss of students to private institutions was particularly serious when considered in light of the number of unemployed teachers in the public sector.
 Duff defended his roll in executing the contract by saying he was involved only in the final stages of the agreement.
 Noting that negotiations were handled by former Deputy Superintendent Roland Langerman, who retired at the end of July, Duff said he had assumed the Montessori School was a non-profit organization because "Rolly Langerman was very thorough and knew the policies."
