The library begins a new season of programs this month, with offerings for all age groups. Many require preregistration due to high demand, but several are open to all on a drop-in basis.

Book-discussion groups for adults will resume at both branches. At the Farmington Hills Library a biweekly Great Books Discussion Group will meet on Thursday evenings at 7:30 beginning Sept. 17. Selections will be chosen from the Great Books Series and from the Norton Introduction to Literature. Both books are available for purchase at the library. Call 553-0300 for details.

The Farmington Branch discussion group will meet biweekly on Thursday mornings from 10 a.m. until noon. September selections include Maxine Kingston's "China Men" on Sept. 10 and "Joshua, Then and Now," by Mordechai Richler, on Sept. 24. Books are available for loan or purchase. Music enthusiasts are invited to a special event, "Confessions of a Music Critic," featuring the Detroit Free Press music critic, John Guinn. "For Parents Only: How and Why Kids Use Marijuana" will be featured at the Farmington Branch on Tuesday, Sept. 22, at 7:30 p.m. Film and discussion, led by Jimmy D. Patton, director of Client Services, Farmington Area Advisory Council, will highlight the program.

Young Adults are invited to join Markus Rothbart, author of "I Wanted to Live the '70s Story," on Wednesday, Sept. 23, at 7:30 p.m. at the Farmington Hills Library. Mr. Markus, survivor of a

number of Nazi concentration camps, will speak about his experiences surviving the Holocaust.

Young people also are invited to learn about their legal rights from attorney Joseph Erlich on Thursday, Oct. 1, at 7 p.m. at the Farmington Branch Library. Erlich will discuss the legal rights, responsibilities and privileges of youth and answer questions.

A new offering will be presented for sixth-, seventh- and eighth-graders at the Farmington Branch Library this year. A monthly book discussion group will be offered on the third Thursday of each month, beginning Oct. 15, from 4-5 p.m. Participants will purchase the six paperback books to be read at a cost of \$9.
