

Rev. Richard Marcis comes to Prince of Peace Church

On Sept. 13, the Reverend T. Richard Marcis Sr. will be installed as pastor of Prince of Peace Lutheran Church at 3:30 p.m. installation service.

The pastor's sons, Thomas R. Marcis Jr. and Peter C. Marcis, will serve as liturgist and lector, respectively. The Reverend Hannibal Frederick of St. Louis, Mo., will deliver the sermon. Reverend John L. Heins, pastor of

Guardian Lutheran Church in Dearborn and first vice president of the Michigan district of the Missouri Synod, will conduct the rite of installation.

Following the service, a reception welcoming the new pastor and his family will be given in the fellowship hall.

Rev. Marcis was born in Ava, Ohio, on July 21, 1931, the 13th of 16 children of George and Mary Marcis. He attend-

ed Concordia College in Fort Wayne, Ind., and received his bachelor's degree in 1951. He continued his studies for the ministry at Concordia Theological Seminary, St. Louis, Mo., graduating in June 1956.

He was ordained in 1956. While serving his vicarage in Hell's Kitchen, New York City, he attended the Hebrew Theological Seminary of America, tak-

ing courses in history and antiquities. He also did field work that summer at St. John Lutheran in Edgerton, Wis., and at Jehovah Lutheran in Pensacola, Fla.

HE WAS CALLED to Concordia Lutheran Church, Jamestown, N.Y., where he served five years until accepting a call to Royal Redeemer Lutheran Church, North Royalton, Ohio, in 1961, where he served until his call to Prince of Peace.

Pastor Marcis has a brother in the ministry, the Reverend Walter P. Marcis, pastor of St. John Lutheran in Cleveland, Ohio, and a cousin, the Reverend Dr. Albert M. Marcis, pastor of Calvary Lutheran Church in Parma, Ohio, and president of a Missouri Synod District.

*Pastor Marcis married Elizabeth Baker, the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Horace Baker of St. Clair, Mo., on Dec. 27, 1956.

Mrs. Marcis is presently head nurse

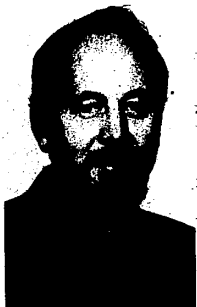

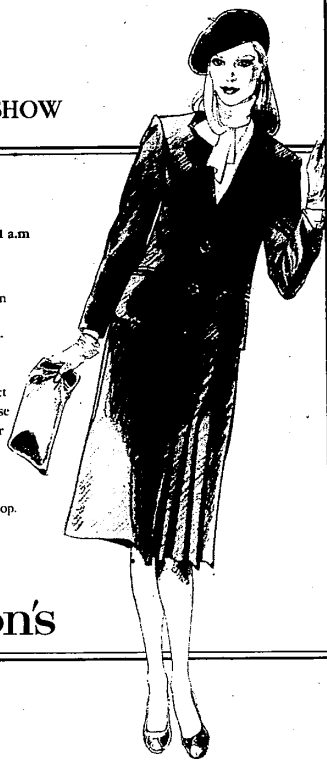

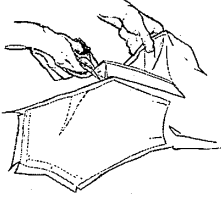
