Walsh College begins \$750,000 building addition

'Administrators don't know quite how to explain the growth surge at Walsh-College that's been going on for the past few years.

They say people are attracted to the school's programs, pricing and reputation so much that they've been force to expand their quarters by more than 10,000 square feet.

The bulldozers have already leveled ground, drainage work is under way and it won't be long before the parking lot is extended, the student longer redesigned, classrooms and faculty offeres added and the library's size doubled.

Walsh College of Accountancy and Business Administration has built its reputation on offering degree programs in accounting, taxation and business management. Bachelor-degree candidates must first complete two years of general-education requirements at a liberal-arts college before being admitted to the specialty program.

ALTHOUGH FALL enrollment figures aren't complete because registration extends through Sept. 10, Barry said undergraduate enrollment is already 13 percent higher than projected, and master-degree enrollments are 34 percent higher than administrators expected.

"It's a great experience to see the American di neducation increase. We make every effort not to turn people away who are qualified, to the extent that we offer classes in the boardroom (due to space constraints)," he added. So far, Walsh's Troy campus has enrolled 1,128 undergraduate students. Of those, 602 are male, and 616 are female. The majority of students, 979, are part-time and 239 are full-time. Barry attributes the increasing enrollment to the college's concern for the student's needs. Most students are in their 30s, married and working full time.


"We offer programs in the evenings, daytime and Saturdays. The quality of our programs is well known, and the college has a good reputation for place-ment after graduation," he said.


