For example, restaurant menus are in braille, and also diplomas and certificates, holiday and greeting cards, cooking recipes and instructions, baseball and other sports schedules, as well as textbooks, fiction and non-fiction.

"It is a time-consuming and rewarding labor of love," Ms. Gill said. Classes begin the end of September and the beginning of October.
