can be met by a simple legislative act making it possible to borrow from one Social Security trust fund for another. I strongly urge that standby autority to borrow from the general fund with interest for a limited period of time should also be provided."

These changes, the ecomomist concluded, "could meet the short-term crisis without destroying the integrity of the Social Security system upon which millions of Americans depend."

Haber commented on several of the specific proposals for Social Security.

The proposal to drop the minimum benefit, he said, "completely overlooks the fact that we are concerned with social insurance and not private insurance."

Surance."

The proposal to reduce the cost of living allowance to less than full reimbursement for inflation "may have some merit, although it, too, would do a grave injustice to millions who depend upon their monthly benefits," he said.

Proposed across-the-board cuts in benefits, he said, are not justified. Better administration and elimination of ineligible claimants are always in order."

The proposal to completely repeal the act and leave old age security to the private sector would be a tragedy, he concluded. "Young men and women in their 30s and early 40s do not have their minds on retirement, and millions do bot pian for it. Society has a serious burden when they Jace old age dependency."
