Elephant-man disease discussed in symposium

Neurofibromatosis, sometimes known as the "elephant-man disease," will be the subject of a free symposium at 4 p.m. Oct. 6 in Henry Ford Hospital's Education and Research Building in Detroit.

Entrance to the building is from Grand Boulevard, west of the Lodge Freeway.

Neurofibromatosis afflicts approximately 100,000 Americans of all races, both male and female. It occurs more frequently than Huntington's chorea,

sickle cell anemia, Tay-Sachs or cystic fibrosis. There is no known cure.

Among the topics to be discussed will be the genetics of neurofibromatosis, its neurological treatment, orthopedic complications and prognosis.

The symposium is sponsored by the National Neurofibromatosis Foundation-Michigan Chapter.

'Life in China is topic for next FACET meeting

Margaret E. Pringle will be the guest speaker for the Farmington Association for Children with Exceptional Talents (FACET) at 8 p.m. Thursday in the North Farmington High School auditorium. Her topic is "Life in China: A Visual Tour."

The lecture and slide presentation is open to all Farmington area families without charge.

Ms. Pringle visited China for three weeks this summer. She was there doing graduate level research in the areas of women's issues, culture and education in the country.

The trip was coordinated by Dr. Joella Gligson-Simpson, a professor at Wayne State University.

Ms. Pringle is a Farmington Hills resident and teacher in Detroit. Two years ago, she volunteered to direct a program for the school for gifted students, but due to lack of funding, LEAP (Learning, Enrichment, and Acceleration Project) was dropped.

She was particularly interested in the program since the oldest of her three sons had been in the first group of gifted students tested in Farmington Hills. Her hopes were to aid neglected gifted children in inner-city schools.

She said one of the questions she asked most often on her tour of China was "What provisions do you make for gifted and talented students?"
