Keynoter beckons the evangelical delegates onward

Christians had better wake-up and get involved in all aspects of the world, including politics. That's the word from Dr. James Kennedy, a well-known evangelical pastor and speaker. Kennedy, pastor of the Coral Ridge Presbyterian Church in Fort Lauder-dale, addressed the first general as-sembly of the Evangelical Presbyterian Church on Tuesday evening at Ward

Christians "have retreated into our little Christian ghetto" and accepted "shackles" that the nation's early lead-ers meant to place on government. Instead, Kennedy stated, "Christians need to let their voice be heard." "In litte the Christian's goal should be to bring glory to God in every sphere," te said to an audience of 945, "Chris-tians need to let their voices be heard."

tains need to let their voices de heart. KENNEDY said the First Amend-ment to the Constitution was meant as a control of government and should not be considered a reason for keeping Christians out of politics. "The First Amendment does not teach the separation of church and state," he said. "Thomas Jefferson taught the idea in a private letter." He added that today there is much distortion in people's minds about the meaning of the amendment, which he called a one-way street, witten in fear

meaning of the amendment, which he called a one-way street, written in fear of the government and intended to re-strain government. "If you don't believe this, look at the press," he said. The amendment puts limitations of the government, but doesn't say anything about limitations on the press.

doesn't say anything about limitations on the press. "Likewise, the First Amendment doesn't say anything about what Chris-tians should or shouldn't do. People who claim Christians should not be in-volved in polities have not read the First Amendment."

THE SPEAKER also said that Chris-tians should have more to say in other
