SUMMARY OF PROCEEDINGS
CITY COUNCIL MEETING
SEPTEMBER 21, 1981

Farmington Hills City Council held a special meeting September 21, 1981. Mayor Pro-Tem Alkateeb opened the meeting at 7:30 o'clock P.M. Members present were Burwell, Seronen, Alkateeb, Lange, Dolan and Oppenbauer. Woll absent. Others present were City Clerk Cairns, City Attorney Poehlman and Planning Consultant Coates.

Council denied introduction of proposed zoning map amending C62-260 to rezone 23-14251-003 and 004, on the south side of 1-606 west of Middlebelt from RA-2 to RC-3. Zoning map amending C62-261 was introduced, parcel 23-256-483-018 and part of 019 rezoned from L-1 and RA-4 to B-1, northwest corner of Nine Mile and Middlebelt.

Proposed zoning map amending C62-262 to rezone 23-18-200-010 and part of 022 on the north side of Howard Road, west of Halsted from RA-1 to IRO, was introduced. Council approved the Agreement between the City of Farmington Hills and Villac-Leman & Associates, Inc., to prepare revised Zoning Ordinance Standards.

Executive Session was set to consider purchase of property, following the meeting. Upon motion meeting adjourned.

REGISTRATION NOTICE FOR CITY ELECTION NOVEMBER 3, 1981

To the Qualified Electors of Farmington Hills, Ward (Precinct 1-24), City of Farmington Hills, County of Oakland, State of Michigan.

Notice is hereby given that in conformity with the "Michigan Election Law, I, the undersigned Clerk, will upon any day, except Sunday and a legal holiday, the day of any regular or special election or primary election, receive for registration the name of any legal voter in said Township, City or Village not already registered who may APPLY TO ME PERSONALLY for such registration.

For the purpose of REVIEWING the REGISTRATION and REGISTERING such of the qualified electors in said TOWNSHIP, CITY or VILLAGE as SHALL PROPERLY apply thereto.

The name of no person but an ACTUAL RESIDENT of the precinct at the time of registration, and entitled under the Constitution, if remaining such resident, to vote at the next election, shall be entered in the registration book.

ELECTOR UNABLE TO MAKE PERSONAL APPLICATION, PROCEDURE

SEC. 491. Any elector who is unable to make personal application because of physical disability or absence from the Township, City or Village in which his legal residence is located, may be registered prior to the close of registration before any election or primary election by securing from the Clerk of the Township, City or Village in which is located his legal residence, duplicate registration cards and executing in duplicate the registration affidavit before a notary public or other officer legally authorized to administer oaths and returning such registration cards to the Clerk of the Township, City or Village before the close of office hours on the last day of registration prior to any election or primary election. The notary public or other officer administering the oath shall sign his name on the line for the signature of the registration officer and designate his title.

UNREGISTERED PERSONS NOT ENTITLED TO VOTE

SEC. 491. The inspectors of election at any election or primary election in this State, or in any District, County, Township, City or Village thereof, shall not receive the vote of any person whose name is not registered in the registration book of the Township, Ward or Precinct in which he offers to vote. (As provided under Act 116, P.A. 1954).

TRANSFER OF REGISTRATION, APPLICATION, TIME

SEC. 506. A registered elector may upon change of residence within the Township, City or Village cause his registration to be transferred to his new address by sending to the Clerk a signed request, stating his present address, the date he moved thereto, and the address from which he was last registered, or by applying in person for a transfer. The Clerk shall strike through the last address, ward and precinct number and record the new address, ward and precinct number on the original and duplicate registration cards, and shall place the original registration card in proper precinct file. Transfers shall not be made after the 30th day next preceding a regular or special election or primary election, unless the 30th day shall fall on a Saturday, Sunday or legal holiday in which event registration transfers shall be accepted during the following day.

TRANSFER OF REGISTRATION ON ELECTION DAY

SEC. 507. Any registered elector who has removed from one election precinct of a Township, City or Village to another election precinct of the same Township, City or Village and had not recorded such removal with the local Clerk shall execute a transfer of registration request, listing the new residence address thereon over his signature, with the election board in the precinct in which he is registered at the next ensuing primary or election. The inspector of election in charge of the registration records shall compare the signature thereon with the signature thereon with the signature upon the applicant's registration record and, if the signatures correspond, then the inspector shall certify such fact by affixing his initials upon said request. The applicant for transfer, after having signed an application to vote as provided in this act, shall then be permitted to vote in such precinct for that primary or election only. The application for transfer shall be filed with the Township, City or Village Clerk who shall transfer such voter's registration in accordance with the application. When the act of any street in a Township, City or Village has been changed, it shall be the duty of the Township, City or Village Clerk to make the change to show the proper name of street in the registration records, and it shall not be necessary for the elector to change his registration with respect thereto in order to be eligible to vote.
