Bishop Emrich Officiates In 2 Area Confirmations

The Rt. Rev. Richard S. Emrich, Episcopal bishop of Michigan, will officiate for confirmation services in two area churches on the next two Sundays.

Bishop Emrich will confirm classes in St. Martin Episcopal Church, 24699 Grand River, Detroit, at 11 a.m. Sunday, March 15, and in St. Andrew Episcopal Church, 16380 Hubbard Livonia, at 4 p.m. Sunday, March 22.

The St. Martin class consists of about a dozen ninth graders, following a new plan of later confirmation instituted by the church this year.

At the same time, young people in the six, seventh and eighth grades, taking courses preparing them for confirmation, will participate in a ceremony that marks their first taking of communion.

ment class numbers 55 to 60 adults and young people in the sixth grade.

Bishop Emrich, born of missionary parents in Turkey, has studied at Brown University,

the Episcopal Theological School in Cambridge Mass., and the Union Theological Seminary in New York, as well as the University of Marburg in Germany where he received the degree of doctor of philosophy.

He served churches in Connecticut and Massachusetts and on the Episcopal Theological School faculty before coming to Michigan in 1946 as Suffragan Bishop. Two years later, he became Diocesan Bishop, with jurisdiction over the eastern half of the Lower Peninsula.

The clergyman has served on numerous boards and committees for both church and community and has been granted several honorary degrees.

He is the author of many articles and books as well as a local newspaper column.

Purim Gifts Requested For Israel

Synagogues in the area are being called upon to make their traditional Purim Appeal, on behalf of the Jewish National Fund.

Purim, which this year falls on the evening of Saturday, March 21, and on Sunday, March 22, is the holiday of "Mishloach Manot," the festival when gifts are given to friends, neighbors, and good causes.

Contributors will be asked to make Purim contributions to JNF that will be used to plant trees, reclaim and develop land, and establish border settlements.

According to Philip Stollman and Harry Cohen, co-chairmen of the JNF Religious Groups Committee, nearly 100 million trees have been planted thus far in Israel by the Jewish National Fund. In addition, JNF has established over 600 settlements, re-deeded millions of dunams of land, and built thousands of miles of roads.

"We must use every occasion to drive home the vital importance of building and preserving Israel," said Stollman and Cohen. "And what occasion could be more fitting for this purpose than Purim."
