

Garage blaze investigated

(Konfara removed several guns from his home and took them to a neighbor's home, backed the two cars out of the garage but not before the left front of one vehicle was scorched and the tire melted).

Farmington Fire Chief Norm Madison agreed with Mariniucci. "They're very, very fortunate they didn't lose the entire home," he said. "The homeowner took time to move the cars, and the addition of extra oxygen when the door was opened fueled the fire."

Any time homeowners have a fire, regardless of how small, they should call the Fire Department right away, Madison added. Firefighters were helped by the fact that when they arrived the fire was confined to the area in which it started, Madison said.

"You can't ask for much more than that. It was a good working fire when we got there, but it was not difficult to fight," he said.

"To protect the house, we ran one line from the front door to the door that leads from the garage to the house, and another line into the main body of the fire."

NINETEEN FIREFIGHTERS from Farmington and Farmington Hills used two engines and a mini-pumper and took less than five minutes to knock down the main body of the fire, Madison said.

"The guys did a good job," he said. "It was an excellent knock down and effective firefighting. The weather really wasn't a factor," he added. "It was pretty mild, the wind was calm and out of the south, and the temperature was 12 degrees."

Neighbors Tom Kujath and Charlie Galea said they tried to help Konfara extinguish the fire with shovels of snow after finding the garden hose frozen.

"We tried," said Galea, "but then fire started coming out of the top of the garage door. We realized then it was hopeless."

Another neighbor, Kathleen Potulsky, said she thought the Farmington Hills Fire Department's response time was unnecessarily slow.

"It took them about 10 minutes to get here," she said, "and that's too long. But that's because we're surrounded by Farmington in this pocket of Farmington Hills (the Farmington Road Corridor, which includes a square mile between Eight and Nine Mile roads on the east and west side of Farmington Road.)"

Madison disagreed with the neighbor's estimate of response time. "I don't think you're going to do any better than we did," he said. "We got a call at 6:31 and were there at 6:35."
