Determining the best films of Ronald Reagan is like defining the redeeming personality traits of James Watt. Good luck. Reagan's best films are ones in which he played a secondary role. "She's Working Her Way Through College" (with Virginia Mayo) and "Desperate Journey" (Errol Flynn) come to mind, as does "Knute Rockne," starring Pat O'Brien. Ronnie was never a leading man. But O'Brien, as the famed Notre Dame football coach, Donald Crisp and Gale Page lead the blocking, so to speak, for Ron as running back George Gipp, a.k.a. "the Gipper."

Incidentally, O'Brien's "Let's win it for the Gipper" speech was long ago cut from the film owing to legal complications brought on by Gipp's heirs. Rating: \$2.80.

"My Friend Flicka" (1954), 11:30 a.m. Sunday on Ch. 50. Originally 89 minutes.

Here's one of the more perverse propaganda films of World War II in that its propagandistic elements are so well hidden amid a good script and moving story. Roddy McDowall stars as an American lad (with an unaccount-

gives them what for as Maria Von Trapp in this Robert Wise-Rogers and Hammerstein collaboration. There's probably no dissuading "Sound of Music" faithful from re-viewing this film. But if you haven't seen it already, don't waste your time. It's sluggish and overly sentimental, and an Oscar winner only because it was a product of a period in filmmaking which contended that bigger was better. Rating: \$2.50.

"Will Penny" (1968), 8 p.m. Wednesday on Ch. 50. Originally 109 minutes.

Director/writer Tom Gries ("100 Rifles," "Breakheart Pass") never broke the big time, but "Will Penny" is a splendidly laconic, naturalistic Western that casts Charlton Heston as an anti-heroic cowpoke. Donald Pleasence and Lee Majors also turn in happily surprising performances. Joan Hackett and Bruce Dern also star. Rating: \$3.05.
