Needlework to be taught

Beatrice Keeber, nationally recognized embroidery instructor, will offer two unique classes for needlework enthusiasts in Farmington Community Center this winter.

Beginning at 9:30 a.m. Thursday, Jan. 28, she will instruct Kogin embroidery. This counted-thread technique of rural Japan can be used in a variety of ways, from embellishing clothing to decorating household items.

Slices of Japanese folkwear will be shown to inspire the student in choosing a project. A tablemat, Oriental wall-hanging or easy-to-make jacket or tunic with patterns copied from an ancient Japanese design are some of the choices.

The six-session class is \$33 plus materials.

A needlework family tree beginning at 1 p.m. Thursday, Jan. 28, will be offering the student an opportunity to create a family heirloom; a personalized, hand-embroidered family-tree sampler.

Mrs. Keeber will teach the simple forms of embroidery used from the 12th to 19th centuries to enhance this project. The eight-session class is \$44, plus materials. Some minimal embroidery experience is recommended.




