Moving beyond the canvas

Only briefly will the viewer be con-erned with what to call Bruce Schar-

cerned with what to call Bruce Scharenberg's art.
Whether they're three-dimensional paintings, mixed media constructions or something else quickly becomes a most point. Scharfenberg's works cast spells. They play tricks on the eyes and the mind. And that's the fun. Scharfenberg, a commuter between Hanover in the UP and this metropolitan area, graduated from Oakland University.

Hanover in the Ur and usin steel opti-tan area, graduated from Oakland Uni-versity in 1972. His family still lives in Farmington Hills. He returns each spring to work setting up new cars for photographing for D'Arcy, MacManus and Masius, Inc.

ONE WORK in his current show at Xochipilli Gallery, 558 N. Woodward, Birmingham, is purely painting on canvass in a non-representational style. Not only is it an impressive painting, but provides continuity, establishing Scharfenberg's background as a painter who worked in a layering technique. He has always liked to build up a canvas with paint and sand it down, softening the final effect and revealing ghosts of former layers.

His new" Arcadian Series" is an extension of this style with added dimensions.

The artist starts with a painted, sanded canvas, puts a wooden frame on top of it with all four edges of the painting stretching out beyond the frame.

THE NEXT layer over the painting is a grid of nylon wire secured to the edge of the frame. To the almost invisible grid, Scharfenberg fifties, in random arangement, bits of torn lacquered paper which from any distance at all appear to be floating in space in front of the canvas.

The top layer is nylon taffeta stretched taut to the edge of the frame and covered at the edges with dressmaker's tape. On this surface, the artist places delicate lacquer paint cutous. These he makes by dropping splashes and bits of lacquer on another the control of the control


