Men's Club will host Dayton youth chorale

One of America's outstanding youth choirs, the Beth Abraham Youth Chorale, of Dayton, Ohio, will appear in concert at 8 p.m. Saturday, Feb. 13, in Congregation Shaarey Zedek. The concert, sponsored by the Men's Club of Shaarey Zedek in commemoration of the synagogue's 120th anniversary, is chaired by Dr. Gerald Laker.

The program also will feature Cantor Chaim Najman, cantor of Shaarey Zedek, as soloist with members of the Dayton Symphony Orchestra.

The choir will be directed by its founder, Jerome Kopmar, cantor of the synagogue in Dayton. The chorale has performed throughout the United States and in Israel and England.

The young people of the chorale take special pride in the fact they have commissioned new works of Jewish music which they have performed to great acclaim. The Dayton Choir also has recorded eight commercial recordings, some of which are in their third edition.

Kopmar points out that perhaps the most important factor in the success of the choir is that "they attest to the fact that traditions and legacies can be taught through music." Kopmar also feels very strongly that Jewish music can be a vital and powerful force in the lives of American youth.

The chorale was founded by its director in 1972. It has established a record of accomplishments that is unique in the American synagogue. With a total membership of more than 90 people, ranging in ages 9-18, the chorale is represented by members of all four of Dayton's synagogues, with the majority coming from Beth Abraham Synagogue, Dayton's only Conservative congregation.

Of all their accomplishments the one that gives them their greatest sense of pride is their record of commissioning new works, utilizing the finest talents in the field of Jewish composition.

Admission to the concert is free, but tickets are necessary, available at the synagogue and school office. The committee members arranging this event with Laker are Leonard E. Baron, Leonard P. Baruch, Robert B. Bayer, Robert L. Biederman, Jerome A. Cohen, Marvin Kasoff, Seymour N. Manello, Lawrence Raitzman, Saul S. Saulson, Max M. Somberg, Dottie Wagner and Max Weinberg.

The concert is being sponsored by I. Murray Jacobs in honor of Shaarey Zedek's 120th anniversary and its youth.
