## Swim clinic conducted

All-American butterfly swimmer, Bob Strube, will host a free clinic for all youngsters interested in swimming at 7:30 p.m. on Wednesday, Feb. 10 at Harrison High School.

The instruction is being sponsored by the Farmington-based Michigan Stingray Swim Association, one of Michigan's oldest AAU (Amateur Athletic Union)-USS (United States Swimming) clubs.

Purpose of the clinic is to stimulate an interest in swimming as a recreational activity, as well as a competitive sport for youngsters of all skill levels.

The competitive swimmer could be a child who has set his sights on a state championship, one who enjoys the water as a form of exercise or a boy or girl swimming mainly to achieve a varsity letter in school and experience the fellowship of an athletic team.

The clinic will open with a discussion of the possibilities open to a youngster interested in swimming. Demonstrations will be led by Strube, head coach of the Stingrays. There will also be exhibitions by state champions as well as youngsters who are new to competitive swimming.

Strube began swimming as a sophomore in high school and went on to achieve All-American ranking in butterfly at Eastern Michigan University (EMU) where he held the 100-yard fly record.

Youngsters of all ages including teens are invited to attend the clinic. No pre-registration is necessary.

Among the prizes to be offered to those in attendance is a month of free swimming with the Stingrays. Refreshments will complete the evening.

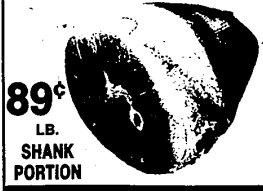
