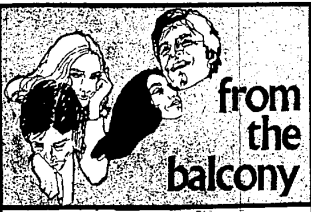

Martin Plans New Twist For Old Tale

Spring will bring a blossoming of theatrical activity for children in the Detroit Metropolitan area as the Henry K. Martin Children's Theater production of "Sleeping Beauty" awakens to a nine day run at the Michigan State Fairgrounds on March 21.

This new concept in theater for children is designed to stimulate the active involvement of the audience. Based on the classic fairytale plot and staged in a multi-media presentation characteristic of the electronic '70s, "Sleeping Beauty" is geared to today's television oriented child. An enchanted princess, a valiant king's son, and wild chess, romps and duets will play across the stage and occasionally into the audience.

Produced and directed by Henry K. Martin, "Sleeping Beauty" will be staged in the Community Arts Auditorium at the Michigan State Fairgrounds March 21 through March 29.

Performances are scheduled at 11 a.m., 1, 3, and 7:30 p.m. each day of the run. Tickets, \$1.50 per person, are available at the door, Sears, Hudson's and Grinnell's. Group rates are available.

Martin Luther King Film Benefit Shown In Area

An area theater will participate in a nation-wide theater party Tuesday, March 24, honoring the late Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.

Proceeds from the benefit will be donated to the Martin Luther King, Jr. Special Fund for grants to the Martin Luther King Foundation, the Southern Christian Leadership Conference and other local and national organizations working to cure poverty, illiteracy and social injustice through non-violent methods.

LIVONIA'S Terrace Theater is one of five theaters in the Detroit metropolitan area

which has donated the theater at no cost for the evening.

Showings will be 2:30 and 8:30 p.m. Tickets, \$2.00, are available at the Terrace boxoffice.

Tickets, which are tax deductible, are priced at \$5 and are currently on sale at the Terrace boxoffice.

This will be the first and only theatrical showing of a full length motion picture depicting Dr. King's life and work. Backers of the project hope to raise \$5 million by selling one million theater seats in

390 cities throughout the country.

THE ENTIRE PROJECT—the talent, the film itself, as well as its promotion, the theaters, all the supporting elements has been totally donated by all concerned. No deductions will be made from the proceeds before being turned over to the special fund.

Supporters of the Detroit area campaign are members of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference, the Detroit Council of Churches of Christ, Church Women United, the Synagogue Council of America, the Human Relations Division of the Archdiocese of Detroit and the Interdenominational Ministers Alliance.
