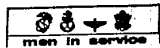

business district of the City of Farmington," Bibben said.

The zoning near Grand River and Farmington Rds. is "quite pedestrian oriented," he added.

"I don't feel these zoning takes into account those pedestrians who get there in automobiles," the attorney said. William Manger, attorney for the businessmen's group, praised the planners for cooperating with businessmen, "particularly in reference to specific businesses which were originally non-conforming in the ordinance."

He added that the planners and businessmen have a basic philosophical disagreement concerning the area to be zoned.

"Our basic objection is to what we feel is the unnecessary confinement of the district," Manger said.

The attorney said less desirable businesses will gather on the margins of the central district, which is roughly the area bounded by Thomas st. on the north, Slocum on the south, Liberty on the west and on the east by a line extending directly north of Mayfield.

THE COMMERCIAL zoning southeast on Grand River should be deep enough to have a series of clusters of stores, Manger said.

This would allow "the business community to fulfill itself in terms of the population growth which has got to occur," he added.

"You're going to have an attractive business community if you let it grow," the attorney commented.

City Manager John Dinan defended the area proposed for

the district saying the ordinance is "tied down to the central business district as we know it."

Jim Platt, a member of the Planning Commission, said the purpose of the ordinance is to group commercial operations.

An ideal CBD, he said, would be "as close to a round glob of land as you can get." The strip type of development tends to require that parking be placed adjacent to each individual store," Platt added. Stores are then separated by driveways and parking spaces, he said, which inhibits pedestrian traffic.

Dinan added that the plaza shopping center near Grand River and Orchard Lake Rds. is automobile-oriented with a smattering of apartments in the area.

The city manager also urged a complete review of the C-2 commercial zone, which is the classification of most of the land on both sides of Grand River.

"The C-2 is quite broad in its scope and probably allows some uses which are not compatible with surrounding land areas," Dinan said.

The possible change has already been referred to the city

attorney for study. He added, and should be given "top priority."

COUNCILMAN John Allen said the area defined in the ordinance should be handled first.

"We are faced with a crisis in this area," Allen commented.

Mayor Wilbur Brotherton said the area defined in the proposed ordinance leaves room for expansion.

"We have problems right down here that we better solve and not dissipate our energies up and down Grand River," the mayor said.

Councilman John Richardson and Fred Siebert also voiced support of the CBD ordinance.

"There is no more reason to extend the area than to extend the business district of Detroit to Joy Rd. just because you happen to have some commercial property there," Siebert said.
