Habsburg is artist of the month

Paintings by Farmington Hills artist Jerrie Habsburg will be on display through March 22 in Henry Ford Hospital's West Bloomfield Outpatient Center. The exhibit is part of an artist-of-the-month series held in cooperation with the Birmingham Bloomfield Art Association.

Ms. Habsburg, who holds a bachelor of fine arts degree from Massachusetts School of Art, studied portraiture under Robert Brackman at the Art Students League in New York City. Her portrait commissions have included Judge Joseph B. Rashid and Lt. Gov. Clarence A. Reid.

Currently an instructor for the Visual Arts Association of Livonia, she is a member of the Michigan Watercolor Society, the Farmington Artists Club (vice president, 1976-78) and the Palette and Brush Club of Detroit.

Her paintings have been widely exhibited in Michigan during the past 10 years.

Last year she won a special award at "The Artist Speaks," a juried exhibition at the American Center in Southfield. She took second place at the Palette

and Brush exhibition in the Pontiac Art Center.

Her other 1981 exhibitions have included the juried invitational of the Birmingham Bloomfield Art Association, "Special Selection" at the Gallery de Boicourt in the Fisher Building and

the First Invitational of the Livonia Cultural League.

Habsburg's paintings may be viewed during weekday and Saturday visiting hours in Henry Ford Hospital's West Bloomfield Outpatient Center, 677 West Maple Road (two miles west of Orchard Lake Road.)

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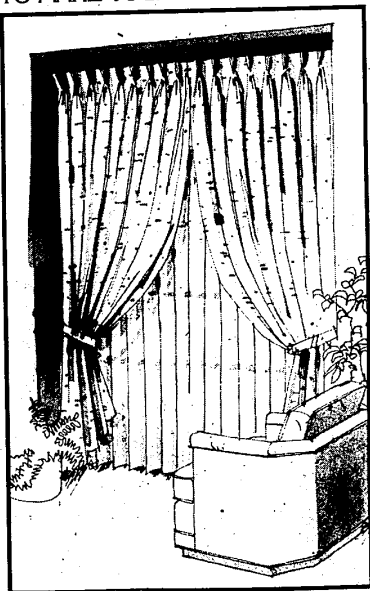
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
