

Lathrup volleyballers spike foe

The Troy Athens volleyball team, fresh off a championship at the Alma Invitational, threw a scare into Southfield-Lathrup's undefeated Chargers Monday, before it fell in three sets.

The Red Hawks defeated Lathrup in the first game, 15-9, and led in the second, 9-0, before the Chargers charged back to take a 15-9 victory. In the deciding game, Lathrup came back from a 9-4 deficit to take a 15-10 win.

The Chargers are 10-0 overall, and 8-0 in the Metro Suburban Activities Association. Athens, meanwhile, is 11-9 overall and 2-6 in the MSA.

Lori Curcio led the Athens attack with 11 serving points, including four aces. Red Hawk setters Pam Bretzick and Sheri Biller performed well in defeat, as did defenders Lori Lechner and Nancy Dean, according to coach Ed Manderfield.

"That was our toughest match of the year," Lathrup coach Lionel Blagg said. "We had to come back to win, and it was tough."

Lathrup was led by Mary Dickes and Diana Reinlein, who each had 18 spikes. Pam Eichler had 14 spikes and eight kills.

Saturday, Athens came out of pool play at Alma with an 8-0 record, and then defeated Merrill in the semifinals and Okemos in the finals to win the championship. The Red Hawks defeated Okemos, 15-12, 16-15, and 17-15, to claim the title.

Jackie Moore was named the Most Valuable Player on offense, while teammate Deirdre O'Brien was the MVP on defense.

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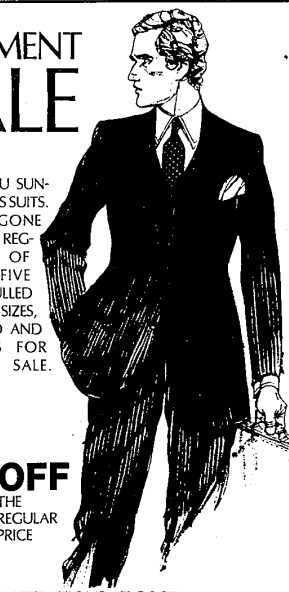
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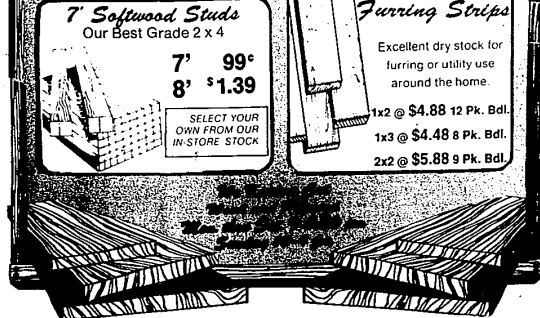
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
