Pacifists have trouble grasping that disarmament is an imaginary concept, like the square root of negative 1. It is the fool's gold of peace. Even if nations scrap their arms, they'll rebuild them the first time someone looks at them crosswise. Disarmament will not bring peace. Rather we must create peace first, before read disarmament will be first, before real disarmament will be

possible.

But treating the disease (creating peace) is harder than yapping about the symptoms (nuclear arms), and the pacifists have no useful ideas on that sub-

ject.
I certainly don't want nuclear war.


