

Coil Baskets made in workshop

The baskets are small, tightly coiled with intricate designs.

Students will learn techniques in class and complete the baskets at home.

The league operates Barat Human Services residential and counseling programs for adolescent girls, abused children and families; Project Transition, a rehabilitation program for women law offenders; Casa Maria and St. Peter Claver Community Centers; Vistas Nuevas Headstart programs for underprivileged preschoolers; and Casagrain Hall, the league's eight-story residence for low-income handicapped and elderly.

Membership dues form the backbone of the league finances as they are continually used as seed monies to help generate grants and public funds for the league agencies.

According to Marilyn Lundy, president of the league, "Recent cuts in government funding will leave league programs and services even more dependent on membership dollars in the future."

Founded in 1906, the league has a history of providing social services to those in need, regardless of race, creed or color.

The league's most recent facility is the Barst Respite Center, an emergency crisis intervention center for abused children.


Rabbi Schulweis currently serves as rabbi of Valley Beth Shalom in California.

He is also an adjunct professor of Contemporary Jewish Civilization at Hebrew Union College in Los Angeles, a contributing editor to Reconstructionist, Sh'ma and Moment magazines.

He is co-author of "Approaches to the Philosophy of Religion" and contributing author to "Mordchai Kaplan: An Evaluation," "Encyclopedia of Morals and Ethics," "American Jewry," "Varieties of Jewish Belief," "The Condition of Jewish Belief" and "Judaism in America."

Rabbi Schulweis is chairman and founder of the Institute for the Rights of the Acted, Documentation and Study Center on Rescuers of Jews in the Nazera. He is the recipient of the United Synagogue Social Action Award, Israeli Prime Ministers' Medal and an honorary Doctorate of Divinity, Jewish Theological Seminary.
