

THE GROOM WORE ... (a) at a semi-formal daytime wedding, an Oxford gray slack coat or stroller; (b) at a semi-formal evening wedding a black tuxedo, cummerbund; (c) at a formal daytime wedding an Oxford gray cutaway; or (d) at a formal evening ceremony, "white tie" and full dress, including white pique waistcoat; pearl studs and links are the proper jewelry.

What Bridegroom Wears

It is the bridegroom's duty and privilege to honor his bride on their wedding day, by attiring himself in the proper clothes for the type of wedding the bride has planned. Formal attire perfectly complements the bridal gown and subtly compliments the bride. Today, most young men do not own formal clothes, but rent them with the assurance that they will fit perfectly.

The attire worn by the bridegroom and other male members of the wedding party, including the fathers, must be consistent. Ushers accessories must be identical, although the bridegroom and best man often wear ties of slightly different design from those worn by the ushers.

Although most weddings are formal, requiring the morning coat can exford-tone cutaway with pear grey flannel waistedat and grey and black striped trousers for formal daytime weddings); and a tailcoat in black or midnight blue with matching trousers for the formal evening wedding, fashion for the formal evening wedding has really blossomed.

The Towne Toggery in Farmington reports that double-breasted models are popular with the young groom, particularly models with a modified shape and six buttons (two to button). Bow ties are bigger, although suburbanites have not yet adopted the floppy Edwardian style. The Towne Toggery reports interest, too, in dark models with pin stripings of color. All formal wear should be ordered at least three weeks before the wedding, with more time required in the months of June and July.
