## Non-Food Items Skyrocket Cost Of Food Budget

About one-fifth of most people's grocery bill isn't food at all but something to wear, read, listen to or clean with.

U.S. Department of Agriculture Economic Research Service reports that 20 cents of each dollar spent at the supermarket goes for non-food items.

About half of the hairpray, aspirin and toothpaste bought is rung up on a supermarket register. Other non-food items that contribute significantly to supermarket spending include light bulbs, paper towels and tissues, soaps and detergents.

And consumers spend more for beer, cigarettes and pet food than they do for fresh beef.
