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TIME IS OF THE ESSENCE
There is a legal phrase: "Time is of the essence", which means there is no toling around with dates in a contract. If your youngster accidentally gets a tooth knocked out and you'd like to give the dentist half a chance to successfully replant it - "time is also of the essence".
Take the typical case where a child gets his front tooth knocked out at a hockey game. He skates over and hands it to his parents and finishes the game. Later on - probably the next day - they'll go see a dentist. Too late, my friends. No chance for saving that tooth.
The proper reaction would be to take Johnnie - skates and all - immediately to the dentist. This is an emergency. A tooth replanted within 30 minutes has a 90% chance of being saved, but in two hours the success rate drops considerably.
To improve the chances of a successful replantation of a knocked-out tooth, rinse it in tap water (don't scrub it), replace it in its socket and the patient hold it in place with his tongue on the way to the dentist.
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
