paper editors are priests," she ex-plained, adding there are now two other female editors. Her career "just happened," she said. "It wasn't planned. I like what I'm doing."

since THE women's movement began, she is often asked about her struggle" to make it in a man's world. "Just fell into it," she said. "We get no subsidy from the diocese. We have to depend on circulation and adventising. There is no such thing as a Catholic, isolated audience. We're sometimes tagged editorially as either to conservative or too liberal." "A lot of Catholies resented the change from saying the mass in Latin. People got so upset. They thought the church shouldn't relar the riles. Now I think it's harder to be a Catholie. The responsibility is on you, not the rules. "You can't go to church on Sunday and be mean to your neighbor on Monday. We're not so hung up on devotions anymore," the editor said.
