

roll call report

Here's how area House members were recorded on major roll call votes in the days before the current Easter recess. There were no Senate votes.

RECESS — By a vote of 209 for and 173 against, the House approved a resolution setting two weeks Easter recesses for the House and Senate. Senators return April 13 and House members on April 20.

Supporter Thomas Foley, D-Wash., said, "It is part of the congressional responsibility to go to our home districts to discuss the many important issues facing the country with our constituents. It is an obligation, not a vacation."

Opponent Thomas Hartnett, R-Sc., said Congress has "done nothing this calendar year for the American people and I think if and when we do come back from the Easter recess it is time we go about doing something for the United States of America."

Members voting "yes" objected to the House recess, although none remained in Washington for its duration.

Reps. David Bonior, D-Mount Clemens, William Ford, D-Taylor, William Brodhead, D-Detroit, and James Blanchard, D-Pleasant Ridge, voted "yes."

Reps. Carl Pursell, R-Plymouth, and William Broomfield, R-Birmingham, voted "no."

ENERGY — The House adopted, 211 for and 163 against, an

amendment to extend for two months rather than 15 months the anti-trust immunity for U.S. oil companies that share information and strategies as they aid the International Energy Agency. The agency is used by the U.S. and Western allies to plan oil allocation and otherwise counter disruptions in world oil supplies. The amendment was attached to HR 5789, later passed and sent to the White House.

Supporters generally had no objection to the immunity, but wanted a shorter extension to give them a earlier opportunity to challenge the administration's energy policies on the House floor. A bill similar to this measure must be considered before the newly granted immunity expires on June 1.

Opponent Tom Cuccoran, R-Ill., said the "real reason" for the amendment was to give advocates of government oil allocation during supply shortages an early opportunity "to bring this issue back to the House."

Members voting "yes" wanted a two-month extension of the limited anti-trust immunity for U.S. oil companies helping the International Energy Agency.

Pursell, Bonior, Ford, Brodhead and Blanchard voted "yes." Broomfield voted "no."

CPA review class at OU on May 1

OU to offer condo course Wednesdays

If you're faced with problems commonly associated with condominium ownership, a noncredit course at Oakland University may help you solve them.

The course, entitled "Condominium Operation: In Depth," will be offered for four consecutive Wednesdays, beginning April 28, by OU's Division of Continuing Education. Class time is 7-9 p.m. Birmingham attorney Robert Meisner will instruct the four-week course at Seaborn High School, Lincoln at Cranbrook, in Birmingham.

A CPA weekend program that provides up to 20 continuing professional education (CPE) hours toward recensure will be conducted Friday evening through Sunday afternoon, May 14-16.

A total of 24 brief classes, covering professional topics of current importance and updates of standard practices, will be instructed by OU faculty and professionals in the field. Tuition is \$15 per class, plus \$15 registration fee.

A CPA Weekend Program, June 4-6, will provide the balance of the 40 required CPE hours in additional classes in the same low-cost flexible format before the July 1 recensure deadline.

Meisner is versed in the legal aspects of condominium operation and well-acquainted with the day-to-day problems encountered in condominium living. He co-drafted the 1978 state condominium statute.

Specific problems of operation — including disputes between association and developer, procedures that streamline the operation of condominium boards and case studies — will be considered.
