stage to work with at the Eagle, Bennett inexplicably eliminates a cruicial sofa in that part of the set, sabotaging the plot and the action.

THE EX-WIFE (overplayed by Jane Shaffmaster) and the lover (David Wilson in a stiff, flat performance) supposedly hate each other, yet Bennett puts them side by side when they should be nose to nose and nonchalantly distant nose to nose and noncuariant, when they should be circling warily,

As the object of Shaffmaster and Wilson's affection, Bob Kaminskis, the writer, doesn't use one gesture that is not cliched or melodramatic. Two disparate people have fallen in love with his love for the English language, yet his speeches are leaden and unin-




