

Grapes from Lake becoming popular

Ask any person interested in California wines today to name its major the Hawaiian-based family of Magons wine-growing regions and he/she will audited the entire Guenor Valley, mention Napa, Sonoma, Monterey, some 23,000 acres, just a few miles and Mendecion and, if sharp, San Luis Montain and, if sharp, San Luis Chances are, one that will not be manded, however valid, is Lake County, Ask the same question two years from now and in all probability Lake will be included, such are the changes about to occur there.

Located immediately north of Napa and east of Sonoma and Mendocino, the county at the turn of the century was major vinicultural region. Phyllosera and, even more, Prohibition changed that and, until the early 1870s, Lake was a region of fruit and nut trees.

The onset of the wine boom in the early 1870s saw the beginning of viniculture there again. Some of the early growers initially banded together to form a cooperative, Koncoti Cellars, an effort that did little to establish the creditability or prestige of the region. creditability or prestige of the region

THE WINERY that did the most to acquaint the world with Lake County in the middle of the "70s, and it continues today, is Mendocipn-based Fetzer Vineyards. The latter half of the decade saw Fetzer providing releases of Cabernet Sauvignon, Zinfandel and Johannisberg Reikling sporting the Lake County appellation.

The vineyard's acceptance, especially for the first two, has signaled to the world that Lake County is coming back as a legitimate vinicultural area.

The late 1970s saw the bonding of a second winery in the area, Lower Lake Winery. Its limited distribution of blancs and Cabernet Sawignon has done little toward enhancing the prestige of the county, but its wines have merit.

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IN TIME a winery was developed, one of some \$4,000 square feet (described in a trade publicatior, recently as "the best-designed winery" it had seen in "all of California") to accommodate its rapidly increasing grape de-

seen in "all of California") to accommodate lits rapidly increasing grape development.

Application was made to the ATF that has resulted in the Guence Valley becomine a distinct appellation, the only instance in California where an entire vinicultural region can be claimed by a single winery.

The goal of the Magons is to be in the 100,000-cases-a-year level by the mind-190s, adding Chardonnay, Chenin Blanc, Cabernet Franc, Protite Sirah and Zinifandel to its repertoire from its now extensive plot of 250 acres planted to grapes.

Its first releases will be in the fall of this year, and it has altrady been signed by a national distributor.

Winemaker Orville Magoon (nonest) will make big wines in a big way. He acknowledges that his domain altady contains three microsome 10,000 acres.

It seems believable that the name Clenoc (Indian, meaning "Land of flying wild birds") Winery will be soon one of those instant success stories later this year, forcing us to acknowledge that another valley name mast be added to the more tradition names of Napa, Sonoma, et. al.

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
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
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
