Heartworm continues to be a problem in this state, the Michigan Veterinary Medical Association reports. Dogs are infected when bitten by mosqui-tose carrying immature stages of the parasite. As the parasite lives off the dog's beart, the dog loss stamina, coughs and suffers shortness of breath.

It takes six months before a heartworm infection can be detected in a blood test. Our pup is more than eight months old and spent a lot of time outdoors last August and September, so a heartworm check was in order.

A healthy dog should start taking a daily pill May 1, we were advised. But don't begin giving last year's letover pills until your dog has had this year's lets.
