Dodd added that the measure "resurrects the ghost of the Tonkin Gulf resultion by giving the president virtually a blank check to undertake whatever military action he deems appropriate without obtaining a declaration of war or without any futher congressional involvement."

Sen. Steven Symms, R-Idaho, the sponsor of the resolution, said the vote at hand was "a vote for the Monroe Doctrine, and a vote for prevention of a Soviet military base in Cuba. It will be a vote for opposing Soviet-Cuban aggression and subversion in the Western Homisphere."
