

Hesburgh to talk at Madonna's commencement

The Rev. Theodore M. Hesburgh, president of the University of Notre Dame, will be the speaker for Madonna College's 1982 commencement, scheduled at 7:30 p.m. Sunday, May 9, in Temple Beth El, 7440 Telegraph, Birmingham.

Hesburgh also will receive an honorary doctorate of humanities from the Livonia school.

Madonna will confer degrees on a record 557 candidates. Diplomas will be presented by the Most Rev. Thomas J. Gumbelton, bishop of the Detroit archdiocese.

THE COMMENCEMENT speaker, 35 years of age when appointed to his present post 30 years ago, recently agreed to continue at the helm for another five years.

His administration has marked major growth at the 139-year-old university, both in its physical facilities and academic development. During his years at Notre Dame he has pushed his conviction that a university needs to do more than train students professionally.

"A Catholic university," Hesburgh has written, "should begin by being a great university in the full richness of modern university reality. It should be a community of scholars learning and teaching, and it should be at the service of mankind's total development in our day."

The Catholic university must be a witness to the wholeness of truth, from all sources both human and divine, while recognizing the true sacredness of all truth from whatever source and the validity and autonomy of all paths to truth.

A NATIVE of Syracuse, N.Y., Hesburgh entered the order of the Congregation of Holy Cross, Notre Dame, in 1934. He was ordained to the priesthood in 1943.

After ordination he continued theological study at Catholic University of America in Washington, D.C., receiving

his doctorate in 1945. He joined the Notre Dame faculty the same year and served as chaplain to World War II veterans on the campus in addition to teaching theology.

Appointed department head in 1948, he was named executive vice president in 1949 and president in 1952.

He has received honorary degrees from nearly 100 colleges, including Dartmouth, Princeton, Brandeis, Yale, the University of Michigan and Michigan State University.

St. M. Francine, Madonna president, said the Notre Dame president had written that he would be "much flattered" to be the Livonia college's commencement speaker and receive its honor.

PARTICIPATING in the commencement program will be Sr. M. Damascene, director of experimental learning, giving the invocation, Sr. Rose Marie, academic dean, presenting candidates to Sr. Francine for conferral of degrees and Sr. M. Laurina, vice president, introducing the guest speaker. Jason H. Tickton, music director at Temple Beth El, will provide music.

County raps new birth-control rules

The Oakland County Board of Commissioners has gone on record opposing a federal regulation which would require family planning clinics to inform parents of minors who receive birth-control drugs or devices.

The board voted 16-9 with for the resolution. Commissioners William Caddell, R-Walled Lake; Dr. Joseph Montante, R-Orchard Lake; and Robert Page, R-Birmingham, opposed it.

"I just don't think it's right to administer birth control to youngsters without their parents' or guardians' knowledge," Montante said.

Marilynn Gosling, R-Bloomfield Hills, chairwoman of the Health & Human Resources Committee, which sponsored the resolution, disagreed.

"Young people won't use the services if their parents have to be informed, and this will lead to many unwanted pregnancies, abortions and child abuse," she said.

The resolution was forwarded to Richard Schweiker, secretary of the U.S. Dept. of Health and Human Services, Oakland County's congressional delegation and Oakland County's legislative agent.

OCC sets senior citizens' day on May 16 at Highland Lakes

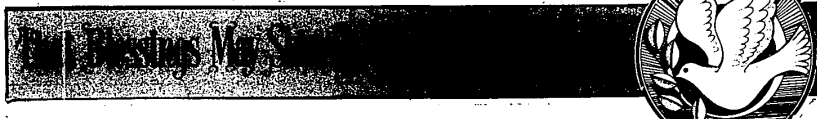
College students are getting older. To prove it, Oakland Community College is hosting a College Day for senior citizens on May 18 at the Highland Lakes Campus.
