4-H seeks host families

Oakland County 4-H families wishing to host a Japanese youth this summer should contact the Oakland County Cooperative Extension Service Office, says Thomas Schneider, 4-H youth agent.

Sixty-two Japanese young people will travel to Michigan through the Michigan 4-H/Japanese LABO exchange program this summer. They will spend a month living with 4-H families to learn more about American culture and increase their proficiency in English.

"The 4-H/LABO exchange program was initiated in 1974 and is coordinated jointly by the LABO International Exchange Foundation and the Michigan State University Cooperative Extension Service 4-H Youth Program," explains Schneider.

For information about the Michigan 4-H/Japanese LABO exchange program, contact Schneider at the Oakland County Cooperative Extension Service office, 658-0889. Japanese youth are tutored by in-

structors at the LABO Teaching Information Center in Tokyo. They also listen to tape-recorded English and Japanese stories and then dramatize the characters in English.

Japanese youths visiting Michigan are paired with 4-H members of the same age and sex. Host families are encouraged not to change their daily routines in an effort to give LABO participants a chance to experience daily American family life. This year, LABO youth will arrive July 23 and depart Aug. 23.

Labor market to be studied

Oakland County has awarded an Oakland University professor a \$30,600 grant to conduct a comprehensive labor market survey of needs and trends in the county labor market.

Donald Warren, a professor of sociology with research experience at OU and the University of Michigan, is

directing the study scheduled to be completed by Sept. 30.

Objectives of the survey team are: 1) to obtain a valid and reliable measure of the short-term labor market structure in Oakland County and 2) to establish a baseline or anchor for labor market conditions in Oakland County as the first step in projecting future trends (one or two years) and needs.

The Oakland County Employment and Training Division considers the data essential for Comprehensive Employment and Training Act (CETA) and other planning.

The survey will use a combination of personal and telephone interviews of present CETA contractors (or recent contractors) and a cross-section of all Oakland County employers.
