Spreen cleared in meat theft probe

Okland County Sheriff 'Johannes Spreen has been cleared of charges alleging that h was a meat thief and that he used county-employed personnel to do chores at his home.

State Attorney General Frank Kelley, in a letter, informed state Police Director Gerald Hough that the investigation "did not develop evidence of criminal conduct by the sheriff or an alleged conspiracy against him." In December, Oakland County Executive Daniel Murphy ordered an autior Spreen's activities after two former aides of Spreen, Undersheriff Robert Nyovich and Spreen's personal secretary, Jacqueline Cey, accused the sheriff of taking home speciality cuts of meat.

He forwarded the audit to the state police, and in turn, the attorney gener-

al was asked to investigate the audit's findings.
"I'm certainly elated. I didn't expect him (attorney general) to find anything wrong. I always believed that truth is the best defense," Spreen said. Nyovich and Cey also charged Spreen with using a deputy on county time for maintenance on Spreen's Farmington Hills home, misusing state road patrol funds and working with his wile Mono Jo to secretly tabe-record conversations with Sherill's Department employees.

IN HIS WRITTIEN opinion, Kelley said that a sherilf does not have a right to receive county food under Michigan law but that "any criminal presecution based on the giving or receipt of county food would require proof beyond a reasonable doubt that the individuals

charged (knew) they should not do so."
Spreen and Murphy agreed that

personal friend of the sheriff!"
In response Kelley said, "Regardless
of the possible need to address this

matter in terms of a management problem. . the evidence furnished us would not support a criminal charge against the sheriff.

Relley also said the investigation din of provide enough evidence that conversations of sheriff's employees were tape recorded without their knowledge.

Spreen said in his 24 years in law enforcement he has been the subject of many investigations, but been cleared each time.
