NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING ON INCREASING PROPERTY TAXES AND GENERAL FUND OPERATING BUDGET

Pursuant to Public Act No. 5 of 1982 and Public Act No. 43 of 1963 (2nd Ex. Sess.) the School District will hold Public Hearings on increasing property taxes for operating purposes and the Proposed Operating Budget. The hearing will be held:

The authorized millage rate of the School District is 34.90 mills. Public Act No. 5 of 1982 would limit the levy to 34.90 mills. The Board proposes to levy 34.90 mills, which it is anticipated will result in a 0% of increase in operating revenues for ad valorem taxes. The Board has the complete authority to establish the number of mills to be levied (34.90 mills) from within its authorized millage rate.

The Board will decrease the debt retirement levy by 50 mills or approximately 12% less than the 1981-82 levy.

Please be further advised that if the electorate of the School District approves a renewal of 3 mills at the Annual Election on June 14, 1982, the authorized millage rate of the School District will be 37.90 mills. The limit imposed by Public Act No. 5 of 1982 is 35.372 mills. The Board proposes to levy proposed additional millage of 2.528 mills or a total of 37.90 mills if the renewal is approved, which it is anticipated will result in a 7.15% increase in operating revenues from ad valorem taxes. If increase in operating revenues from ad valorem taxes will have the complete authority to establish the number of mills to be levied (37.90 mills) from within its authorized millage rate. Due to the State Aid Formula, the increase in operating revenues from ad valorem taxes will be offset by a decrease in State Aid. As a consequence, the School District's total operating revenues from these sources in 1982-83 will increase less than 2%.

Copies of the 1982-83 Budget are available for inspection at the Offices of the Board of Education.

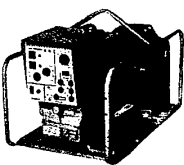

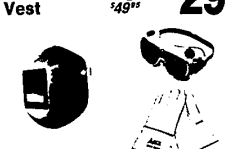

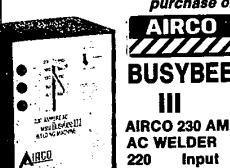
