

# Upset-minded Lahser shocks Andover

High-school tennis upsets are rare indeed, but Bloomfield Hills Lahser pulled one off Tuesday when he nipped back-yard-rival Andover, 4-3.

No. 3 doubles was the deciding match. All other matches were finished by the time Lahser's serene Tummala and Jeff Stittler defeated Tim Brice and Mike Chlado, 7-5, 2-6, 7-5.

"It was just picture-book tennis," said Lahser coach Jan Esper. "Whenever you get Lahser and Andover together, it's bound to be good."

The No. 1 singles match went to Andover's Jon Loomis, who beat Ed Raloff, 6-2, 6-0.

The result left Lahser with a 4-3 record. Andover is 7-2.

ANDOVER HAD an easy time with two recent opponents, whipping Ferndale and Rochester Adams by 7-0 scores.

Against Ferndale, a Southeastern Michigan Association foe, Andover's No. 1 doubles team of Denny Andrews and Rich Schwartz needed three sets to beat Tim McIntee and Kolin Stutcher, 6-2, 1-6, 8-6. Tom Bodwell and Rob Stovin blanked John Collins and Mark Fastbinder, 6-0, 6-0.

Against Adams, Jon Loomis, Andover's top singles player, stopped Eric Essen, 6-0, 6-0. Kevin Hurt won No. 2 with scores of 6-2, 6-0 over Bob Wagner. At No. 1 doubles, Ron Shapiro and Bob Lepater beat Jeff Stegg and Pete Gubbe, 6-1, 6-0.
