

Nagel is top seed in \$1,000 tennis tourney

West Bloomfield High School student Ed Nagel is the No. 1 seed in the first annual \$1,000 winner-take-all men's singles tournament at the Royal Oak Racquet Club.

The tournament, sanctioned by the United States Tennis Association, starts May 14 with the finals scheduled for May 16. The field will be limited to 32 players who will be selected by the tournament committee based on past records.

Nagel, a junior at West Bloomfield, was ranked No. 14 in the nation in his first year of 18 and under. He began the professional circuit in 1981 by playing

in several Penn tournaments.

Last year, playing in the boys' 18 and under tournament, he reached the quarterfinals of both the National Indoor and Western Open tournaments, and the semifinals of the Easter Bowl.

In December, Nagel played the Australian pro circuit, where he picked up a \$1,000 prize. He then played the Professionals (ATP) points. He then played the Southern Australian Junior Championships, where he reached the semifinals of the singles tourney and won the doubles competition.

Earlier this year, Nagel played tournaments in Kenya and Germany. He

currently holds an ATP singles ranking of No. 450, and he is No. 350 in doubles.

Nagel, a 5-foot-10, 145-pound 17-year-old, plans to play the major junior tournaments this summer. His coach is Mark Costi, a former Big Ten champion and circuit player.

Entry deadline for the Royal Oak Tournament is May 10. Trophies will

be awarded for the finalists, with \$1,000 going to the winner.

● **ROW, ROW, ROW**

The men's national rowing championships return to the Detroit area for the eighth time since 1872.

The 106th annual National Rowing Championships will be July 16-18 at Stony Creek Metropark near Rochester. The regatta, hosted by the Detroit Boat Club (DBC), will be conducted by the Friends of Detroit Rowing.

The DBC hosted the fifth national regatta in 1877, and then held its most recent events in 1939 and 1959. In 1927, the nationals were held at Wyandotte.

Minneapolis (1941) has been the only other Midwestern site for the National Rowing Championships.

● **BIKING IT**

The 23rd annual Wolverine "200" Bicycle Marathon will be May 22-23 at Belle Isle.

The marathon, sponsored by the Detroit News and the Schwinn Bicycle Co., is promoted by the Michigan Bicycling Federation in cooperation with the Detroit Parks and Recreation. There is a \$5 entry fee.

The marathon's challenge is to ride as far as possible from 10 a.m. May 22 to 10 a.m. May 23. Overnight camping will be allowed that evening only.

Each participant receives a patch and mileage rocker. Also, entrants have the opportunity to win some of the \$15,000 in prizes, including 10 Schwinn bicycles and dozens of plaques and trophies.

Perry races coming soon

The fourth annual Perry Drug Store-sponsored races are scheduled for May 30 in Waterford Township.

Upwards of 2,000 men, women and children are expected to participate in the four-mile and one-mile races. All proceeds will go to the Easter Seal Societies to benefit crippled adults and children.

Plaques will be awarded to the top placers in each of the 23 race divisions, plus the first three wheelchair placers in both races. Also, the youngest and oldest finishers of the four-mile race and the family with the most finishers will be awarded plaques.

T-shirts will be supplied to all four-mile and wheelchair race entrants. One-mile entrants will receive patches. Certificates will be given to all participants who finish their races.

Race participants who collect \$10 or more in pledges to the Easter Seal Society will be eligible for a give-away drawing of 30 ten-speed bikes donated by Bristol-Meyers Co.

The entry fee is \$6 for the four-mile run, and \$1 for the mile run. Forms are available at any Perry drugstore in Michigan.

● **SMA RELAYS**

The Southfield Relays will take place tomorrow at Southfield High School for all the girls' track teams in the Southeastern Michigan Association (SMA).

Field events will start at 4:15 p.m., and running events will start at approximately 6:30 p.m. Southfield Athletic Director Fred Goldberg says "this is the first of many to come."

The league's other members besides Southfield include Troy, Bloomfield Hills, Andover, Birmingham, Seaholm, Berkley, Hazel Park, Ferndale and Royal Oak Kimball.

The United States Mutual Corporate and Community Challenge five-mile run will be 10:30 a.m. May 15.

All profits from the run will be donated to the Detroit Partners Program, a joint program of Project PRIDE and the Detroit Recreation Department. The Detroit Partners Program supports parks and recreation programs, refurbishes and maintains important city landmarks and gives camperships to underprivileged children in Detroit.

The run starts at Cobo Hall, continues along the riverfront on Atwater Street through the warehouse district, and ends at the Renaissance Center parking lot south of Atwater.

There will be a \$7 fee per runner, and all participants will receive a T-shirt, entry certificate, refreshment tickets and be invited to the post-run on the riverfront.

Register now for OU camps

Oakland University is currently accepting registrations for its summer athletic camps.

The camps include boys' and girls' basketball, golf, soccer and swimming.

The boys' basketball camps run in two sessions, from June 20-25 and June 27-July 2. The camps, for persons ages 8-17, will be directed by OU's head basketball coach Lee Frederick and his assistant Steve Hebold.

The camp cost is \$145 for residents, and \$125 for commuters.

The week-long girls' basketball camps begin July 11 and July 18, and are for persons ages 8-17. Dewayne Jones, OU's head women's coach whose team qualified for the national NCAA Division II championship finals this season, and his assistant Pat Graves will be camp directors.

The soccer camps are for persons between the ages of 9 and 18, and will cost \$175 for residents and \$150 for commuters. The two week-long sessions begin July 18 and July 25, and a special advanced camp is slated to begin Aug. 1.

The soccer camp directors is Gary Parsons, the school's head soccer coach.

The golf camps, for persons 12-18 years, run from June 20-25 and July 27-July 2. Bill Rogers, OU's golf director and PGA pro, is camp director.

And, the boys' and girls' swimming camps, headed by Pete Hovland and Mark Johnston, begin June 20 and June 27. The week-long sessions cost \$145 for residents and \$125 for commuters.
