

Lady of Mercy outruns Marian

Farmington Our Lady of Mercy School kept its perfect record intact with an easy 97-25 victory over Birmingham Marian Thursday afternoon.

Double-winner Cathy Bridges took the long jump in 15-feet, 5 1/2-inches and the 440-yard run in 1:33.7. Doris Jackson won both the 100-yard dash (12.4) and the 220-yard dash (32.5).

Jean McCarthy and Ellen McCarthy won the two mile and mile runs, respectively. Cecie Kelly won the 110-yard hurdles (1:17) and Mary Jo Gorski took the 220-yard hurdles (33.4).

Mercy's winning 880-yard relay team included Jackson, Chris Lawton, Gorski and Bridges. The winning mile relay foursome included Kelly, Carolyn Burt, Kim Wiser and Bridges.

Marian's lone winner was Julie Brenner in the discus (81-4).

Mercy, 3-0, will not run until next Monday when it hosts Harper Woods Regis. Marian hosts Bishop Gallagher and Regis 4 p.m. Thursday.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 20 of Act No. 40 of the Public Acts of 1965, as amended, a petition was filed with the County Drain Commissioner of Oakland County, Michigan, petitioning for the following project, to wit:

Location, establishment and construction of an intra-county drain to be located substantially as follows:

Beginning at a point on the Tarabush Creek, a tributary of the Rouge River, 60 ft. south and 2420 ft. more or less, west of the N.E. corner of Section 4, T.15, R.9E., City of Livonia, Wayne County, Michigan; thence northerly to the north line of Section 4 also being the south line of Section 33, T.1N, R.9E., City of Farmington Hills, Oakland County, Michigan; thence northerly to the south line of Farmington Acres Subdivision, No. 2; thence northerly along the Tarabush Creek to the north line of said subdivision, also being the south line of Tarabush Roseland Gardens Subdivision; thence northerly and northerly through said subdivision along the Tarabush Creek to Gill Road; thence northerly across Gill Road; thence northerly along said creek to the south line of Fend's Hillside Subdivision; thence northerly through said subdivision along the Tarabush Creek to Brigsden Avenue; thence northerly across Brigsden Avenue; thence northerly along the Tarabush Creek 210 ft. more or less, to a storm water storage facility; thence northerly, southerly, and northerly through said storage facility 2750 ft. more or less, to its end also being designated as Point A, located 1550 ft. east and 190 ft. more or less south of the N.W. corner of Section 15, thence southerly and northerly along said Tarabush Creek to 9 Mile Rd.; thence northerly across the 9 Mile Road and Drake Road intersection to the west line of Drake Rd.; also being the east line of Heather Hills Subdivision No. 3; thence northerly across Heather Hills Subdivision; thence northerly along said Tarabush Creek to the Corporate Boundary between the City of Farmington Hills and the City of Farmington; thence northerly into the City of Farmington along the Tarabush Creek to the south line of Chatham Hills No. 3 Subdivision, Section 29, City of Farmington; thence northerly and westerly along said creek to Smithfield Rd.; thence westerly across Smithfield Rd.; thence along said Tarabush Creek through Chatham Hills No. 3 Subdivision and Chatham Hills Subdivision to Britanny Hill Dr.; thence northerly across Britanny Hill Dr.; thence northerly along said creek to Point B located 1580 ft. east and 440 ft. more or less, south of the N.W. corner of Section 29, thence northerly along said creek to the north line of Chatham Hills Subdivision; thence northerly along said creek to Grand River Avenue; thence northerly across Grand River Avenue to the north line of Section 29, City of Farmington, also being the south line of Section 29, City of Farmington Hills; thence northerly across Grand River Avenue; thence northerly 60 ft. more or less, to a storm water storage facility; thence northerly 600 feet, more or less, through said storm water storage facility; thence northerly along said creek to Halstead Road; thence southerly across Halstead Road and into Section 16; thence southerly 400 feet, more or less, through a storm water storage facility to M-102; thence westerly across M-102 to a point on the eastern line of Sincola Industrial Park Subdivision, said point being 390 ft. north and 830 ft. more or less, west of the S.E. corner of Section 19, said point herein designated as Point C.

Thence southerly through Sincola Industrial Park Subdivision to a point with the Grand River Avenue right of way, said point being 1140 ft. west and 89 ft. more or less, north of the S.E. corner of Section 19, said point herein designated as Point D.

Also continuing at the above designated as Point C, thence northerly 300 ft. more or less along the eastern line of Sincola Industrial Park Subdivision; thence westerly 810 ft. more or less, through Sincola Park Industrial and Supervisor's Plat No. 11 Subdivision; thence southerly 600 ft. more or less, through Supervisor's Plat No. 11 to the south line of said subdivision; thence southerly to the above designated Point D.

Thence southerly across the Grand River Avenue and Ten Mile Road intersection, entering Section 30, to a point located 40 ft. south and 1510 ft. more or less, west of the N.E. corner of Section 30; thence southerly 60 ft. more or less, to a point located 210 ft. south and 1920 ft. more or less, west of the N.E. corner of Section 30; thence southerly to Industrial Park Drive; thence southerly across Industrial Park Drive; thence southerly 1000 feet, more or less, through a storm water storage facility, said facility located along said Creek within Outlot B of Farmington

Freeway Industrial Park No. 1 and Lots 58, 59, 63, 64 and 65 of Farmington Freeway Industrial Park, thence southerly across Research Drive; thence southerly through Lot No. 39 of Farmington Freeway Industrial Park No. 3 to the southwest corner of said lot, said corner lying on the east line of I-275 and herein designated as Point E; thence northerly 650 feet, more or less, along the east line of I-275 to a storm water storage facility, said facility being a point of ending.

Also continuing at the above designated Point E southerly across I-275; thence southerly and westerly along the Tarabush Creek to a point on the east right of way line of Haggerty Road, said point being 1650 ft. more or less, south of the north line of Section 30, City of Farmington Hills; thence southerly across Haggerty Road to the west right-of-way line of Haggerty Road which is the Point of Ending. Section 25, T.1N, R.9E., City of Novi, Oakland County, Michigan, 1500 feet south and 60 feet, more or less, west of the northeast corner of Section 25, and coincides with the outlet from the storm water storage facility for the Stonehenge Development located within the S.E. ¼ of the N.E. ¼ of Section 25.

Also beginning at Point A located 1530 ft. east and 190 ft. more or less, south of the N.W. corner of Section 33, City of Farmington Hills; thence northerly to 9 Mile Road; thence easterly within 9 Mile Road to Gill Rd.; thence northerly 1500 ft. more or less, within Gill Road to a point north of M-102, a Point of Ending.

Also beginning at Point B located 1580 ft. east and 450 ft. more or less, south of the N.W. corner of Section 29; thence southerly along a tributary of the Tarabush Creek to a point located 650 ft. east and 800 ft. more or less, south of the N.W. corner of Section 29; thence southerly to a point on the east line of M-102, located 195 ft. east and 1005 ft. more or less, south of the N.W. corner of Section 29; thence across M-102 to a point on the west line of Section 29, located 1100 ft. south of the N.W. corner of Section 29; thence southerly along the corporate boundary between the City of Farmington Hills and the City of Farmington; thence southerly across M-102 into Section 30 of the City of Farmington Hills to a point on the west line of M-102 located 180 ft. west of the east line of Section 30; thence southerly along said tributary of the Tarabush 25 ft. more or less, to a stormwater storage facility; thence southerly through said storage facility 300 ft. to a Point of Ending.
