

Troy topples Birmingham Seaholm, 7-2

Defense, coach Don Sacketh thought, would be Seaholm's strength this season.

But it hasn't quite worked out that way.

"Our goal at the beginning of the season was to finish above .500, but we've been doing better than that," said Sacketh, whose Maples are 9-5 overall and

5-4 in the Southeastern Michigan Association (SMA).

"Actually, we've been doing better than I thought we would. Our pitching has been better than I thought it would be, and our hitting has been better than I thought it would be."

"But our defense has been erratic. That's what's really been hurting our pitchers. Our pitchers have been performing well, but they've been hurt be-

cause of the mistakes we've been making defensively.

"We could be in first place (in the SMA) with a little better defensive effort," he said. "But we still have an outside chance for a league title."

It wasn't defense, though, which hurt Seaholm Monday against Troy. It was a lack of offense.

The Maples, who split a double-header over the weekend against Cranbrook, lost 7-2 to the Colts as they mustered just four hits.

Losing pitcher Scott Schumaker, a junior, fell behind early, and Seaholm never caught up. The Colts built a 4-0 lead and scored three times in the seventh to ice the game.

Seaholm's runs came in the sixth inning on run-scoring singles by Scott Pech and Carl Hochstein. Dave Wuerth contributed a triple in that inning.

The winning pitcher was Randy Maier, a senior right-hander making his first appearance on the mound this year. Troy had 11 hits.

Against Cranbrook, Seaholm lost the first game, 10-1, but took the nightcap, 9-4.

In the opener, winning pitcher Allan Daniels hit his personal record 4-0 as he struck out seven and allowed six

hits. The run that Seaholm scored as the first earned run that Daniels has allowed all season.

The Cranes started fast, scoring three times in the first inning on singles by Jeff White, Mark LaFontaine, Mark Reuss and Daniels.

LaFontaine had a triple and single and two RBIs, while Daniels, White and Reuss each had two hits.

Scott Pech had a pair of singles for the Maples.

Dennis Wuerth was the winning pitcher for Seaholm in the second game. He allowed six hits and struck out four.

Seaholm's 13-hit attack was paced by Mark Sacketh with three singles and Wuerth with a triple and single. Scott Pech highlighted a three-run first inning with a solo home run.

Seaholm will play a 4 p.m. SMA game at Bloomfield Hills Andover tomorrow.

"Right now, we're just looking for-

ward to our pre-district game with Birmingham Groves (4 p.m. May 28 at Seaholm)," said Sacketh.

ST. MARY'S stayed in contention for the Catholic League crown with a 6-2 victory Monday over St. Florian.

The Eagles are 5-2 in the league, while Wyandotte Mt. Carmel won its first place with a 6-1 record. St. Mary's is 6-9 overall.

The winning pitcher was John Miletich, who struck out 15 batters and allowed only four hits in only his second start of the season. Miletich, a sophomore up from the junior varsity, pitched a no-hitter in his first start recently against Ann Arbor Gabriel Richard.

Miletich was supported by nine hits and 11 Eagle stolen bases. Miletich accounted for two hits and one RBI himself.

CITY OF FARMINGTON HILLS
SUMMARY OF PROCEEDINGS
CITY COUNCIL MEETING
May 10, 1982

Farmington Hills City Council held a regular meeting May 10, 1982. Mayor Burrell opened the meeting at 7:25 P.M. Members present were Burrell, Lange, Doan, Hughes, Soronen, Williams and Wolf. Others present were City Manager Savage, Assistant City Manager Costick, City Clerk Cairns and City Attorney Bibeau.

The agenda was approved with two additions: 9.c. Consideration of appointments to Historic District Commission, and 9.d. Consideration of Executive Session to discuss pending litigation.

The minutes of April 26th were approved with corrections.

City Council approved the agreement with Metrovision of Oakland County, Inc. and authorized its execution by the Mayor and City Clerk.

Council adopted the Ordinance providing a nonexclusive franchise to Metrovision for installation of a cable TV system. The summary of the Ordinance was approved for publication.

Council approved purchase of 50 voting devices to be made from Election Supplies Limited and for a file for master registrations from Doubleday Bros. & Co.

No action was taken on request from Common Ground for a grant. Consideration will be made at a budget session.

Council appointed Randall Winston to fill the unexpired term of John Donohue and Joseph Hovanessian to fill the unexpired term of Shirley Stadler on the Historic District Commission.

Council approved an Executive Session immediately following the regular Council meeting.

Council authorized the City of Farmington Hills to prepare specifications and solicit bid proposals for the reconstruction of the 47th District Court road.

City Council established Wednesday, June 2, 1982, at 7:30 P.M. as the date and time to hold a Public Hearing on the proposed 1982-3 Fiscal Budget for the General Fund, Major Street and Local Road Funds, Federal Revenue Sharing Funds and Debt Service Funds; that the City Council hold a special meeting the evening of June 7, 1982, at 7:30 P.M. for the purpose of considering the adoption of the 1982-3 City Budget. Meeting adjourned at 9:20 P.M.
