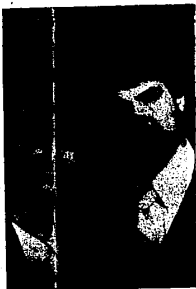




Goldberg — Goldbaum

Aspiring poets called to workshop

Children's author and poet Vickie Najjar Teichner is looking for about a dozen serious minded fourth and fifth graders to sign up for a poetry workshop.

The workshop is a first-time venture for both her as well as Farmington Branch Library. It will run for six sessions this summer under the sponsorship of the library and was initiated at the request of children's librarian Jill Locke.

The Farmington Hills resident, who is author of "The Eastlip Adventure," took to a round of poetry reading through the spring in local and nearby libraries to test her original poems before they were sent off to the publisher. Her aim was to get response and reaction from the youth to see how they felt about her poems.

She got the giggles or the pensive silence that was appropriate, and says now, "It looks like I'm going to be going back to teaching."

TEICHNER completed student teaching for her secondary education certification in Farmington High School and now teaches English to adults in Troy.

But poetry has always been "the biggest joy of my life," she said. "I need the beauty of poetry in my private life and I've been a student of poetry for as long as I can remember, both the classics and the contemporary."

She said she wanted her new class of poetry students to know there would be a little bit of work involved for the par-

ticipants. There will be some class work and some homework.

Her students will get instructions in how to listen and will be practicing techniques to stimulate the imagination, "the two biggest factors for creating," she said.

"They will learn basic forms of poetry, the use of rhyme, meter, repetition, metaphor and simile, but the listening-communication skills and using imagination are paramount," she said.

Teichner's own mentor is Lee Bennett Hopkins, "a name familiar to lovers of children's poetry everywhere," she said.

THOSE FROM 9-11 who join Teichner's poetry workshop will meet from 7-8:15 p.m. on Wednesdays beginning July in the library at 23550 Liberty Street.

"Registrations from those who are willing to spend some of their summer evenings doing just a little bit of work to stimulate their imaginations will be taken on a first-come, first-served basis," she said.

Registration for summer library programs traditionally begins on the last
