It wasn't so many years ago that mortgages were nothing special. You picked out the house you wanted, put down a little money on the purchase, and got a plain, fixed-payment, long-term mortgage. It's not so simple anymore.  
Interest rates are high, and they are volatile. Banks must pay high interest on the money that comes in, and cannot afford to lend it out for less. At current rates for long-term mortgages, monthly payments would be higher than many people can afford to pay. What are the alternatives?  
With a variable rate mortgage, monthly payments are tied to lending rates. If rates go up, the lender is protected; if they go down, the borrower gets a break. With a negative amortized loan, the difference between the going rate and the bargain rate is added to the principal.  
Some lenders have come up with a shared-appreciation mortgage; they share the risk with a lower-than-market-rate loan. When the house is sold, or at a predetermined time, the lender gets a portion of the profit. A similar program lets an investor supply most of the down payment for a later share in the capital gain.  
Sometimes a seller provides the loan at a rate a few points below a bank's, usually for a short period. This assumes that rates will drop and that the buyer will qualify for a bank mortgage at that time. These loans have been written so that a "balloon" payment of the entire amount is due in a year or two, which leaves buyers AND sellers in a difficult position when rates don't drop.
