

Handicapped honored at concert

Margaret Koltz, choir director at Harrison and Farmington high schools, has granted the Year of the Handicapped (1981) an indefinite extension. The Farmington Hills resident's large group takes the stage at 8 p.m. tonight as the Farmington High School choir performs "On the Sunny Side," "The Lord Bless and Keep You" and a selection of country-western tunes. Nearly 20 ninth through 12th graders will sing "Let the Sunshine In," "On the Sunny Side of the Street," "The Lord Bless and Keep You" and a selection of country-western tunes. Koltz last week raised \$100 for special ed students in a similar concert at Harrison High entitled "He Ain't Heavy, He's My Brother."

Harrison physical therapist Dan Schneider, a health professional usually more impressed with numbers charted on progress reports than with those of the musical sort, had high praise for Koltz's concert. "We appreciated the cash, but more the thought," Schneider said. "We mostly appreciate the way Mrs. Koltz has helped her students create a non-judgmental environment without movement criteria for belonging to the choir."

Koltz, whose choir groups include handicapped students, says special ed students need "every bit of help they can get."

"I just feel by lending any help we can to people less privileged than ourselves we are gaining that much ourselves. There's too much taking when there should be more giving," she said.

Funds raised through the concerts will go toward the Special Olympics,

therapy, field trips and other programs for the handicapped. Tickets for tonight's performance

are \$1.50 for adults, \$1 for students and senior citizens and are available at the door.

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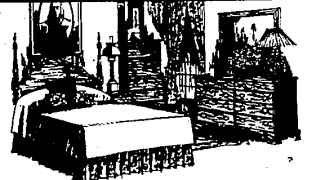


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
